US citizens or permanent residents enrolled in or planning to enroll in an accredited college or university full-time in 2020. There is no minimum GPA requirement. The basis for awarding the scholarship will be the passion of the applicant, as represented by their writing sample.

- c. Please post this to a personal website, social media page, or blog in order to share this learning and awareness opportunity with others.
