Please remember that you can only hit "Submit" once. If you submit an incomplete application (i.e. incomplete essay), your scholarship will not be considered for scholarship opportunities. To help you prepare for the essay, please see the prompt/directions below. Please see Mrs. Waters with any questions. Good luck!

Essay prompt: Submit a statement providing information that will distinguish you from other applicants in terms of your goals, aspirations, and achievements. You may indicate other information about yourself that may help the scholarship committee discern your need for a scholarship.

FORMAT: 1 page (single or double spaced), Times New Roman font, normal margins (1"), title is not necessary. Do NOT go over the page limit or your application will not be reviewed.
