Due to the nature of the violation and/or because other means of correction are not feasible and/or have failed to bring about proper conduct and/or the presence of the student poses a danger to others or a threat of disrupting the school environment, it is my recommendation that expulsion be considered for Timothy Ibanez, who was involved in the following incident:

On May 19 at approximately 1:30 pm information was received indicating that Timothy had used marijuana during lunchtime. Upon making contact it was noted that Timothy had the normal objective symptoms of someone who had been using marijuana, and upon questioning Timothy admitted using marijuana at lunchtime. This is Timothy's third suspension this semester for using marijuana. Suspended 5 days. Parent was advised that there is a possibility that the suspension may be extended pending an expulsion hearing, based on the outcome of an administrative meeting. YTD: 13 days.


After an administrative meeting, it was decided to extend Timothy's suspension pending an expulsion hearing based on the repeated offenses.

This incident constitutes a violation of Education Code 48900, section c.

c. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.

Due to this being Timothy Ibanez' third incident of using illegal drugs this school year, and due to the repetition of such incidents, expulsion is recommended.

Dear Mrs. Ibanez and Timothy:

This letter is to inform you that Rick Hamilton, Principal of Mt. Whitney High School, is recommending to the Board of Education for the Visalia Unified School District that Timothy Ibanez be considered for expulsion from the District. The recommendation is based upon Timothy's involvement in the following incident:

On May 19, 2017, at approximately 1:30 p.m., information was received indicating that Timothy had used marijuana during lunchtime. Upon making contact, it was noted that Timothy had the normal objective symptoms of someone who had been using marijuana. Upon questioning, Timothy admitted using marijuana at lunchtime. This is Timothy's third suspension this semester for using marijuana. This incident is in violation of Education code 48900, section c.

- c. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.

A hearing, conducted by the Administrative Panel appointed by the Board of Education, has been scheduled for **June 21, 2017 at 10:30 a.m.** in Conference Room 11 Visalia Learning Center located at 630 S. Atwood, Visalia, CA. in the Cruz Bustamante Building. Parent/guardian must accompany student to the hearing.

If you cannot make this appointment, you have the option to either re-schedule (once) or give the district permission to proceed with the hearing without your presence. In either case please call 730-7584 to inform us of your decision.

The time scheduled for the hearing is tentative, and the hearing may be delayed until later in the day depending upon the availability of witnesses, conflicts with scheduling of other hearings, or other necessary reasons. The hearing will be in closed session unless you desire it to be open to the public, in which case you must notify the Superintendent or myself at least five (5) days before the date set for the hearing.

Attached to this letter are copies of the rules of the District pertaining to discipline. Please note in particular that you have the following rights:

1. Appear in person or employ and be represented by an attorney at the hearing; or be represented by a non-attorney advisor who is familiar with the facts of the case.
2. Inspect and obtain copies of all documents to be used by the District at the hearing;
3. Confront and question all witnesses who testify at the hearing;
4. Question all other evidence presented and present oral and documentary evidence on the student's behalf, including witnesses.


For planning purposes, the District would like to know if you intend to bring a representative to the hearing. The District requires notification five (5) days prior to the hearing.

Timothy's previous suspension for this incident will be extended until the date set for the hearing. Such extension is authorized by Education Code 48911 (g) whenever the pupil's continued presence at school constitutes a danger to persons or threatens to disrupt the instructional process. During this period of suspension, Timothy shall not come on campus for any purpose during school hours without first obtaining the permission of the principal or principal's designee.

Pursuant to Education Code 48915.1 (b), you have an obligation to notify any subsequent school district that your child has been expelled, is under a suspended enforcement of an expulsion decision, or has an expulsion hearing pending.
